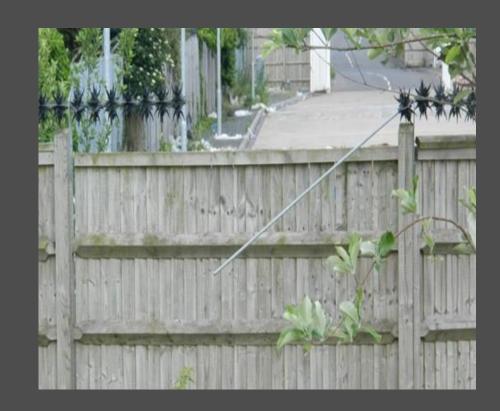
# Failure

It's Almost Inevitable



The impact that Security failures can have are simple to understand, whether it's:

- The pure cost associated with the compromise of valuable assets.
- Disruption caused through the loss of critical infrastructure on which the delivery of key business services are dependent, or;
- Reputational damage and the resultant loss of business generated by being seen not to be secure.

Failure is not inevitable, but that inevitability is increased by the actions of an organisation.



The actions of organisations can be seen at all levels, but within security it is highlighted by:

- Limited Threat Appreciation exacerbated by analyst competency and that of their target audience.
- Procedural non-compliance aggravated by their practicality, being misunderstood, deliberately ignored or disregarded through custom and practice.
- Over dependence on 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractors, who operate with limited or no oversight.
- Security not being integrated and managed within an organisation's governance regime.

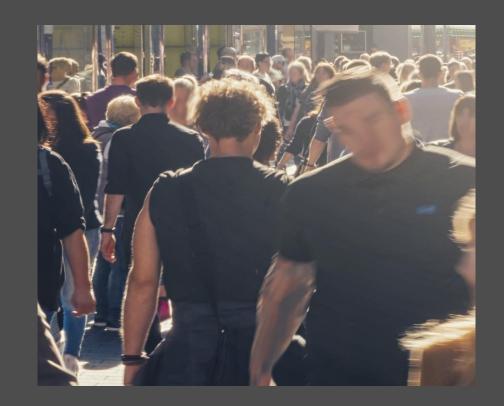
And it is this, when combined with culture, that can lead to failure



If the only measure taken of security's success is the frequency of incidents it is probably based on a false premise, as it is difficult to prove any corelation between the two.

Understanding the potential security has for the reduction in the number incidents is more aligned with:

- Exploiting a series of data points and through analysis providing predictive information not only on compliance but emerging vulnerabilities brought about by changes in the threat and operational landscape.
- Bringing security within an organisations governance regime to increase accountability, responsibility and visibility.
